



# Background

If you or someone you know has experienced domestic violence, you are not alone. More than four out of five American Indian/Alaska Native adults are survivors of violence.<sup>1</sup> Compared to all races, American Indian/Alaska Native people are twice as likely to experience violent crimes.<sup>2</sup>

Domestic violence can take many different forms:<sup>3</sup>

- Isolation from others and one's community
- Pronounced gender stereotypes that play into unequal power dynamics
- Intimidation
- Manipulation, especially in situations with children
- Emotional abuse, including insults, threats, gaslighting, or humiliation
- Financial abuse
- Cultural abuse, which can include intimidation, hurtful stereotypes, or preventing someone from participating in traditions
- Spiritual abuse, which can include preventing someone from practicing spiritual beliefs or attending ceremonies or misrepresenting beliefs

Domestic violence is not traditional. Your mind, body, and spirit are sacred. You are strong and can break the cycle. Get support, make a plan, and break free with help from this resource guide.



## About This Resource Guide

This resource guide was created to provide a list of available resources related to intimate partner violence.

This document was developed by the Great Lakes Inter-Tribal Epidemiology Center (GLITEC), a program of Great Lakes Inter-Tribal Council, Inc. (GLITC). GLITEC is one of 12 Tribal Epidemiology Centers (TECs) nationwide. GLITEC serves the 34 Tribes, four urban Indian communities, and three Indian Health Service (IHS) units of the Bemidji IHS Area, which includes the states of Michigan, Minnesota, Wisconsin, and the city of Chicago.

GLITEC's mission is to support Tribal communities in their efforts to improve health by assisting with data needs through partnership development, community-based research, education, and technical assistance. GLITEC strives to be responsive to the health information and epidemiological needs of Tribes by providing training, technical assistance, and other useful resources.

This resource guide mainly focuses on the Bemidji Area and is organized by state. It includes statewide resources, resources for the four urban communities served by GLITEC, and resources for each Tribe (as available). In some cases, no Tribally run resources were able to be identified. In some cases, non-Tribally run resources are included for some Tribes, especially if no program was identified for that Tribe. National resources are also included at the beginning of this guide. When possible, resources and services specifically for American Indian/Alaska Native people were included in this guide.

This resource guide was created through the COVID-19: Prevention of suicide, intimate partner violence (IPV), and adverse childhood events (ACEs) in Indian Country project with funding provided by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

GLITEC has produced this resource guide for informational purposes only. It has not reviewed or vetted any programs mentioned. GLITEC is not able to endorse the programs.

- Comprised of a national network of more than 180 local crisis centers that combine custom local care and resources with national standards and best practices
